1	Galatians	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Read the book of Galatians each week 2. Keep a journal of questions as they read 3. Read David Levy, <i>Guarding the Gospel of Grace</i> – an FOI book (134 pages for Galatians, adds commentary on Jude but I would not have them read that) – We would divide the Galatians section into 8 parts for reading each week (there are 12 major sections in the commentary) 4. Consider doing a five-page report the last week on “insights learned from the internship and Galatians” in paragraph form with bullets. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 3 Meetings. 2. Start of summer week 1-Saturday evening for a two-hour session. 6-8 PM. 3. Second time is Saturday at the end of the 4th week. (Boys’ week 4) 4. Third time is Saturday at the end of the 8th week. Girls’ Week 4. 5. Discuss selected issues & answer questions concerning the text & commentary.
2	Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5-7)	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Read Matthew 5-7 each week 2. Keep a journal of questions as they read 3. Read J. Dwight Pentecost, <i>The Sermon on the Mount: Contemporary Insights for a Christian Lifestyle</i> (Counting intro chapter has 29 short chapters) – We would divide it up to 3 or 4 chapters per week for reading. 4. Consider doing a five-page report the last week on “insights learned from the internship and the Sermon on the Mount” in paragraph form with bullets. 	SAME
3	Genesis 1-11	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Read Genesis 1-11 every two weeks (4 times for the 8 weeks) 2. Keep a journal of questions as they read 3. Still looking here: One thought is to use Jimmy’s notes on this (he has a little pamphlet on Genesis 1-11) OR to use Henry Morris’ commentary <i>The Genesis Record</i>. I’ll keep looking. 4. Consider doing a five-page report the last week on “insights learned from the internship and Genesis 1-11” in paragraph form with bullets. 	SAME
